This includes direct management over the companies Emergency Operating Procedures, Field Operating Procedures, Engineering Specifications, Integrity Management Plan, Construction Specifications, and Operational Technology (OT) Cybersecurity procedures. Title will be determined based on the successful candidates' relevant experience, knowledge, skills and abilities.
